#### Financials:

- Scott Shultz covered 2023 financials including banking balances.

- Vendor review:
  - Will continue with current pool vendor
  - Lawn company is now taking care of our sprinkler system
  - New company will be maintaining the pond at a cheaper rate than the old vendor
- Dues will not be raised this year, will remain at \$420 for 2024.
  - Cash App will be available as a payment method this year.

### Increased costs for 2024:

- Insurance costs:
  - Annual costs are going up almost 70% for the next 3 years. Majority of costs are due to the pool house roof replacement.
  - Discussed shopping our current insurance company. Not all insurance companies offer HOA insurance. The companies we spoke to were also seeing a spike in prices.
  - Water costs up 50%
  - o Electric up 30%
- Covered projected budget for 2024

### Work Days:

- Need to plan a couple of work days throughout the year. Volunteers are needed.
  - Pool house needs to be painted.
  - Christmas lights

# Discussion:
